At least 192 killed in wave of violence between drug gangs in northwest Mexico

The council, which consists of members of Sinaloan society such as academics, business representatives and nonprofits, said that to date, nearly 200 murders and 226 disappearances have been reported since the onset of the violence on September 9.

Around 200 families have fled the violence, with 180 businesses closing and 2,000 jobs lost amid the armed conflict between the leading factions of the Sinaloa Cartel.

Following the arrest of notorious drug kingpin and Sinaloa Cartel co-founder Ismael "El Mayo" Zambada on July 25, a violent shift in the power dynamics of the cartel founded by Zambada and Joaquin "El Chapo" Guzman, who is serving a life sentence in a US prison, took place.

Germans fear rising cost of living

- Inflation, migration, expensive housing — these are the things that most people in Germany are worried about, according to the latest study "Germans' Fears 2024".
- If there is one thing that scares Germans, it is the thought of a gaping empty wallet. For the third year in a row, the fear of a higher cost of living has been ranked number one in R+V Versicherung's annual fear ranking. Even though inflation continues to fall, companies are paying out inflation bonuses, and wage settlements are also high, people in Germany still remain skeptical.
- "This is a really deep-seated fear in Germany. In the 33 years of our study, the fear of the rising costs of living has been the number one fear in our study for a total of 14 times. As soon as prices go up, this fear resurfaces."

UN probe says Israel targeting Gaza healthcare system



Israel is deliberately targeting health facilities and killing and torturing medical personnel in Gaza, UN investigators said Thursday, accusing the country of "crimes against humanity." "Israel has perpetrated a concerted policy to destroy Gaza's healthcare system as part of a broader assault on Gaza," the United Nations Independent International Commission of Inquiry said in a statement.
